

MNPS is a national leader in establishing an evidence-based high-impact tutoring program for students in the greatest need of accelerating outcomes.

Since Accelerating Scholars launched in the fall semester 2021, MNPS has provided high-impact tutoring to over 7,000 students with the help of over 2,000 tutors.

Using a mix of volunteers for one-on-one virtual or in-person tutoring, along with qualified teaching staff for paid small group support, **the district has created opportunities** for high-quality academic interventions in reading and math.

TRAINING REQUIREMENTS AND TUTORING DETAILS

Accelerating Scholars

• Volunteers will be trained on content, how to structure a tutoring session, the web-based tutoring platform that tutors and students will use, and more.

High-Impact Tutoring for Nashville Students

- Volunteers will provide three, 30-minute-long, or two 45-minute long, oneon-one, virtual or in-person tutoring sessions every week for at least 12 weeks each semester. Session times will be matched to each volunteer's availability.
- Accelerating Scholars tutoring sessions can take place during the regular school day or during structured before or after-school programming. This will be a convenient and easy process, and your impact could make a lifetime of difference in the lives of Nashville's students.

WHAT TUTORS AND STUDENTS CAN EXPECT

- A personalized and positive learning experience for students
- A boost in skills, confidence and academic outcomes for students who may need a little extra help and support
- A focus on 1st through 8th grade reading as well as 4th through 9th grade math - with all instructional content reinforcing and amplifying classroom lessons and curriculum

Rites of Passage

Male Mentoring for Grades 4-8

MAKE A DIFFERENCE IN OUR SCHOOLS AND THE COMMUNITY BY BECOMING A TRAINED RITES OF PASSAGE FACILITATOR!

About the program:

- 18-week program for 4th-10th grade male students
- The program services Tier 2 students
- Group sessions meet at least once a week, for 30 minutes to an hour

Program focuses on three areas:

- To increase students' daily attendance
- To decrease behavior incidents
- To decrease suspensions and expulsions

Data from 22-23 school year for Rites of Passage shows:

- Students who participated had 91% attendance rate
- Students who participated accounted for 6% of all school behavior incidents
- Students who participated accounted for 7% of all school Out of School Suspensions

Purpose:

As **Coordinator** you will be the designated point of contact and organizer for your church/school partnership.

Responsibilities and duties:

Church Coordinator

Job Description

- Attend a one-time Coordinator Orientation.
- Attend the Year-End Celebration in June.
- Attend the Coordinator Convening in July.
- Schedule a United4Hope staff check in each summer.
- Attend an initial meeting, facilitated by United4Hope, with the School Liaison to hear about the school's engagement opportunities and establish a partnership.
- Attend quarterly Partner Meetings at the school.
- Stay in touch with your school liaison through phone calls, texts, emails, or in-person meetings to hear about needs at the school and communicate your church's commitments.
- Serve as a mouthpiece to the church for the school partnership and the opportunities to serve.
- Recruit volunteers and help them get onboarded with United4Hope by attending orientation and submitting a background check.
- Assist volunteers in getting plugged in to an area of service at the school, taking into consideration their talents and passions.
- Follow up with volunteers for feedback and address areas for improvement with the School Liaison and/or United4Hope staff.
- Be a lead encourager for your school and your church's volunteers!



Church Coordinator

Qualifications:

- Servant leader who enjoys connecting people to opportunities
- · Vision driven person who can lead a charge
- Comfortable with events and trainings
- Process-oriented
- Engaged or very interested in community partnership and public schools
- Natural influencer/leader who attracts many generations
- Education experience is NOT necessary

Commitment expected:

Commitments vary across churches, based on the capacities of the church and the expectations they set with the school. The average coordinator spends 10-15 hours a month. We simply ask for consistent engagement with the school.

Training:

Each coordinator begins by completing an orientation with the **United4Hope** staff. Each quarter, there is a Continuing Education opportunity to meet with other coordinators, hear special guests talk about pertinent topics, and consider best practices.

The **United4Hope** staff is available throughout the school year for support, consultation, and to celebrate YOU!

HOW DOES THE BACKGROUND CHECK WORK



Submit your background check here in 2 minutes or less: Background Checks - PENCIL (pencilforschools.org)



Check your email for a confirmation from Asurint and complete the authentication process.



Watch for a clearance email coming from Asurint. This typically takes 5-7 business days.



Once you have received the clearance email, forward to your church coordinator, so that he or she can get you plugged into service opportunities at the school!
